

## ABOUT LINDE RESERVE

The Council wants to turn Linde Reserve and Dunstone Grove into another passive open space.

The **Friends of Linde Reserve/ Dunstone Grove** has a much better idea - building on this area's unique strengths to turn it into an **arts eco park**.

Linde Reserve and Dunstone Grove comprise a 2.8 hectare park opposite the Avenues shopping centre in Stepney.

It has open space, significant trees, a playground and a concreted stretch of Second Creek.

Cottages from Stepneys' forgotten German history, a Scout hall and the Perriam Centre, (used as a community hall) are scattered around the reserve.

There is also a disused bowling green.

But what makes Linde Reserve and Dunstone Grove really special is the fact that it is the home of several important arts and community groups - the St Peters Women's Centre, Knee High Puppets, No Strings Attached Disability Theatre and 3D radio.

These groups could be the basis of a unique **arts eco park** that would be the only one of its kind in Adelaide.

**Friends of Linde Reserve/Dunstone Grove** has been established to promote this vision.

	COUNCIL'S PLAN	THE COMMUNITY'S VISION
<b>Second Creek</b>	Restore the creek by cutting down 14 significant trees, including a River Red Gum.	Restore the creek and keep more trees. The creek can work around the trees - just as happens in nature.
<b>Historic Cottages</b>	Bulldoze no 64 and 66 to open up the area, and sell no 48 (a heritage listed villa).	Keep the cottages for their historic value and as a home for arts, environment and community groups.
<b>Community, Arts and Environment Groups</b>	Move them out to other accommodation - except for the Women's Centre.	Keep the groups in the Reserve. They make it unique and they will be the basis of a more developed <b>arts eco park</b> .
<b>Car Parks</b>	Cut car parks from 96 to 52. (Does council want fewer people to use Linde Reserve and Dunstone Grove?)	Keep as many car parks as possible - they will be needed for the many visitors who will be attracted to the Linde <b>arts eco park</b> .
<b>Bowling Green / Community Garden</b>	Turn it into a car park.	Turn it into a community garden. There are already 40 volunteers for this project. What could be more sensible than a sustainable gardening showpiece?
<b>Playgrounds and Toilets</b>	Improved and age appropriate playgrounds. Modern toilets.	Agree
<b>Cyclists and Pedestrians</b>	Network of cycle and pedestrian paths.	Agree
<b>Soundshell and Amphitheater</b>	Not part of the council proposal.	A venue for the many performances that already occur in Linde Reserve and others that could happen in the <b>arts eco park</b> .
