

The Community's vision for Linde Reserve/Dunstone Grove: An Arts Eco Park

Norwood Payneham and St Peters Council wants to knock down three historic cottages (including a community centre) force 3D Radio, Knee High Puppeteers and No Strings Attached Theatre of Disability out of this reserve and turn it into passive open space.

Moving and accommodating all of these groups will be expensive.

Friends of Linde Reserve/Dunstone have a better idea – we want to keep the cottages, and the community groups and add a community garden. This would make Linde Reserve/Dunstone Grove into a unique arts eco-park. This won't stop people using the reserve to walk their dogs, or use the playground and recreational facilities.

This map only indicates areas where the Friends disagree with council. The Friends of Linde Reserve/Dunstone Grove agree with a number of council proposals such as upgrading toilet and playground facilities.
